People can't Simply Be allies during certain events, like World Pride quote, this weight that we're carrying is crushing and Relentless, we need our allies to shoulder some of the burden. And I'm going to put my emphasis on the next bit of the quote because you can't celebrate with

us at World Pride and then scatter, when the attacks come end quote, I'll actually not in quote, if you want the pride in the glitter and the confetti you also have to stand with us when it's uncomfortable and scary too.

Bang on Bulls-Eye target there Georgie because this is a huge concern. It's really a sort of coming to a head. A few weeks ago, when I had the fabulous, do you know Curie on the show at when I was up at chill out, which was a wonderful time. He spoke of an experience at Mardi Gras. We're a 78. Privilege your comfort is not at the center of this discussion. Well, put. So let's look at privilege. I would put myself, you know, sort of middle to Upper if you had to rate privilege, one of the things that I program titled this program Ally, do do's and don'ts. One of the things people do is they tend to look at privilege in a one-dimensional way. So, for example, a gay man, hypothetically might say, well, I'm gay compared to a

Sexual man, if I've got this privilege but of course if you're rich, white gay man, you might have more privileged than a very poor gay person, gay men of color and so we can't we can't look at it. One dimensional and I think this is a big mistake that people make a need to stop doing. And I'm the first to admit that I've plead guilty to this in the past where I thought because I'd faced discrimination certainly as a bye.

By and trans woman. In terms of my neurodivergent, swear a particular workplace said to me we don't know how to talk to you because of your neurodivergent. So we don't talk to you which is a breach of their duty of care. Sorry they're positive duty to eliminate discrimination in a workplace and they still didn't do reasonable adjustment. Even after I went to the Victorian equal opportunity Human Rights Commission which is abysmal. I thought I'd heard it all, you know, pretty horrible experiences when it.

Part of you a net or use the term, an attribute is attacked. But of course, I don't know what it's like to be a person of color a refugee, an Aboriginal Torres Strait Islander or First Nations person. And the thing that I do is I try to shut up and listen and tell other white people to shut up

I'm not am yet to see a full diagram of all privilege. I mean, there's always things that get missed which is actually going to be the whole point that I was looking at it and the through that struck out to me or to that I'd never thought about before. I was on say that I was aware, I was wide. And that entailed privilege of the I'd be honest and say I didn't know.

Much it meant at the time, come back to that but the to that left out at me in this case were that I'd always had a roof over my head so never homeless and it was all and then there was one that flows from that it was always of my own choosing. I've never been held in custody / incarcerated. The other one, though was educated and it's a privilege that in Australia given that we push people to go to school or some might do homeschooling we perhaps don't.

Think about. And I'd be the first to admit that I hadn't. And what does that privilege entail? Well, now yes, it's all very well to use. Sometimes fancy words like trans and gender diverse and polyamorous but does everyone know what they mean? Probably not and you know labels are important on them, you know what to affirm people's labels. But how then do you find a win-win solution may have to explain the labels. You may occasionally have to use language that isn't ideal. I mean sometimes if talk

Thing about misogyny is MM. Well, cisgender men of any sexuality, not just heterosexuality can be misogynistic and I've certainly experienced that from gay men. I've experienced it a couple of times from by men only rare and it stings because usually by men are pretty good on anything to do with gender and self-awareness. This was some guy on an email list when they were around and it's

Yes, of knowing that, that privilege is there in that mild, you know, sort of intersectional way is really, really important. I mentioned that of the lists, I've seen not all of them, cover everything. I think neuro Divergence needs to be listed separately on any list of attributes where you're considered privileged or not. And I think that given the fact that so much talk about all the various forms of neurodivergent is really, I don't know only begun to

Flow through in the last 20 years. Particularly the last five give or take and I'm being very rough there. Perhaps a lot of neurotypical, people haven't thought about their privilege and I know lots you haven't. And the thing is, I don't know everything about every other form of neurodivergent and, what we need to do. So we just have to be open to learning be in the present moment. Ask people, what sort of reasonable adjustment. They need. I know that when I used to work in office setting

Before I left from home which is now largely been for the last four years. One thing, my neurodivergence as a deep processing introvert and highly sensitive person. I couldn't stand constant interruption just get your concentration going and someone comes by with some innocuous query and Ghibli being as well. God Almighty, did you really have to ask me that then? And you would try to say look, can I have say two solid hours to get my work done? And then we can have a chat? No, it had to be important had to be done urgently. So all those sorts of things.

And as I said, I've been victim blamed for my neurodivergent sin, a workplace. But it is about looking at our privilege, sort of in this multifaceted way. I'm not sure if there's ever some sort of ranking or weighting, 30 NG that we could do to look at it all and had, of course, how do we objectively place herself? I mean, obviously, yeah, I've got white privilege and I'm largely got Anglo-Saxon privilege, but

Set of how high, how high is it is at a 95 or 99 out of 100? Something in each case where as compared to being trans is obviously lower than cis and he's a trans woman lower than a trans man sometimes. Yes, sometimes no, you know, it doesn't matter but in the wider scheme of things, you know how to how do you put all this down? Do my hidden disabilities mean, anything? They

In the past. They don't mean as much to me anymore. So, all these sorts of things to consider, but I bring all this up, because I think there's two unconscious bias forms of privilege that get overlooked a lot. And one is what I call middle, and there's very similar in a way. One is what I call middle class privilege, which despite the fact that I might appear too many to be middle class if we're measuring that by income and wealth, believe me or not. And the other one which is kind of similar. As what I call corporate privilege, we live in a society.

Body that privileges the corporate sector in very rough terms. The corporate sector over the small business sector over the public sector over the community sector whilst the community sector, the workers there in picked up, I think some ground during the pandemic because of the amazing things that health and Community workers did in terms of management and

Leadership the community sector doesn't often get looked at as privileged. So there's this one of the things that goes wrong in two big don't

In our ship is savior, complex. And I've seen corporates come in thinking, they have to tell Community organizations how to do that. I was on a took part in an event of years ago, you had to pitch for funding and the way I was spoken to as a community sector person by someone with a corporate background on how to speak and how to write my pitch. It was if I didn't know anything and it was really patronising another time I had someone with a corporate commercial media.

Grand start telling me how to write yet use articles and do media. And I've been doing it for 20 years and there was an element of misogyny ISM in there as well. Funny how they seem to combine sometimes funny as in sad funny as opposed to haha. Funny. Really, so all these things can come into it. And you know, I think that we sent to start looking at these things because I think I'm going to come back to middle class privilege in the next segment, because I think there's a big one there that links into the recent

people. Because many people are now feeling really let down by a cisgender, go and cisgender lesbian so-called allies. I had lots of support during this latter, half of March, people would ring up

Um message or whatever and say how's it going, you okay anything I can do which is wonderful. Other people less fortunate me don't have that and it's about giving those people space. I was it one. I'll just say Gathering of trans. People wear watch, trans people of color, queer, people of color, queer. And trans pit migrants and similar refugees were going through this

Far scarier than what I was experiencing but we need that leadership. We need it to come from the top. And yeah, we got that in Victoria, you know. Well done to Daniel Andrews and John Pacific pursue do for their actions. Although criticism does go to John pursue, do for the slap, on the wrist, to more redeeming. And so we need these things done, but we need more than just these things. We need positive.

Funded campaigns orbit, funding organizations, to do that, the advocacy and Edge. Proactive education work. And about last year, they did the same again, and this is the debate that we have to have, and why they're not doing enough, or they only just really concerned about groveling to politicians for the sake of their own funding or if they and other really committing to their values and doing allyship. And, and how would they doing it? Are they making helping trans, you know, just what we'll say walking with trans people excusing. Any ableism in that?

Or just being with trans people to make sure that we can energy to get the energy, we need to keep going and stand being with us or are they doing savior complex? Are they butting in after

trans people?
