Again, drags Tran peep trans people of color, queers of color women. They just stood up to the cops and it was over like three.

Nights. They were there day and night defending, the Stonewall Inn against the police, and the police eventually had to retreat. Now that was pretty gutsy and the that that victory was not only a victory for that moment, but that's what launched the international Gay Liberation movement at as

It was called then. So we have Stonewall to thank for the queer movement today. Yeah, it certainly was a major factor there had been lots of important events for that. The Compton Diner, right? Is San Francisco as one. But it really was that one where the momentum just sort of broke through. And people are just said enough of this outright blatant discrimination.

Action and vilification and persecution. This has we've got to turn this around and now I know it's something, I think about a lot. I mean yeah, I've been out now for what is it over? 28 years. But I think about people who went through things in times before me and what they went through. Rugby and Thena have done. So this just shows that when you can get the voices going to Grassroots and get the common sense back when you've got people like 3 CR, you know, on shows like 3 CR.
