This idea that basically there's not enough abundance for everyone, you know, we're getting two concepts which are different of slightly different of jealousy and envy and so you work through the emotions you communicate. It takes work. Really monogamy should do the same. If you're if you're in a monogamous relationship, if that's what you and partner have decreed yourselves to be to be, you could be a be either way you could be.

Polyamorous bisexual heterosexual, or gay or lesbian for that matter. Any sexuality at all, should mention that but if it's don't know if you can, you know, sort of work through your emotions and you know, like knowledge to them feel them. Some people need to do that and then you've sort of move past them. That's a pretty good thing to do, whether you're monogamous or polyamorous. So polyamorous people already are, are offering their abundance to the world.

Godless of who people are, which is a cool thing to do and advantages of polyamory. Let's say you are in a polyamorous situation. So you've got three adults, you know, sharing a house together and there's a child involved. Well, there's more people to either pick up the child from school or welcome the child home. One of my friends recently is now told me that she and he's a good point. She is using the label trips combination of transience his which I like as well and I think they didn't all this stuff. I always say this every more labels there are the better because it makes people connect with who they are. And remember, once as a diversity educator, I got a piece of feedback on one of our forms. Why do we need to know? 117 gender identity labels? And

72 sexual orientation labels. Well, you're not going to win them all lucky. You, if you're heterosexual and don't have to think about your gender and therefore could come under cisgender and a few years ago I did do a show about why cisgender people particularly cisgender gays and system two lesbians get so riled up about their sort of

Either use of the term cisgender. I'm not sister in denied, not, I don't want to be cisgender. Well, no one's forcing you to use a label, but theoretically, you are, get over yourself and all that sort of thing. And I think that it's important that we recognize that there is so much Beyond this either. Or I mean, we don't just go from night to day. We go through Dusk, and Dawn, and Twilight. And there's not just Youth and all the people there's sort of roughly a middle.

Would've age. There's all sorts of possibilities. And there's also gender identity, which is how you sort of see yourself my dear friend and my fab educator novo's is in describes as well. It's like if you are trans come under trans or similar it's like you've got a like a can of tomatoes. But inside, you know you are lentils and how do you convince everyone that you know what's inside? What's on side for you?

It can be difficult in a society that's conditioned to believe that you're supposed to be a certain way, just because of the outside of your body at Birth and thing is, even if people aren't seeing your body, this then gender expression where shoved into boxes again. There were certain people supposed to wear certain clothes of certain colors, which, of course, is not true. Either pink was apparent was a boy's color, a man's color, not too long ago and it wasn't just reclaiming.

that you might want to ask and say which pronouns you asking me to use or asking me to use today can be a thing as

Well, so pronouns, yes, definitely important for all transform for all people might say. Oh, I shouldn't expect for a final ride, but for Trans and gender diverse people. A very important thing because offered our identity has been denied and that's not yeah, sort of what we would like and

Of course, there's a whole range of variety nature as well, both in the animal and biological Kingdom. And so, you can't really assume things on these sorts of things and for non-binary people, that's where it's important to make sure you have a whole range of options to record people's gender. If it's the best approach really is to just have a blank line and let people freeform in whatever they want, and they will put it in.

And go from there. So yep. Lots of things to think about you're correct yourself. If you realize you've made a slip, allow our a non-binary person, or an ally to correct you, if you make a non-slip and I've most of all hope you had a great. If you are non-binary from this binary trans woman, hope you had a good day on Friday and felt very recognized and visible. If that's

Momentum is critical is something that I would say and finding your sense of self and your sense of connection and your tribe or tribes plural. Because of course we don't like binaries on this show really, really important. And yeah, with what age you come out and come out will say comfortably and safely as best as you can is important.

Is a lot of emphasis on coming out and not everyone can and can dog and or can do it safely. And I think that sometimes forgotten when we talk about coming out I remember the fabulous. Maria peyote Caroli telling me for years ago about how a client that she'd heard about, not of hers directly was tall. You definitely have to come out and it just wasn't safe where the person was living at the time and it caused more problems. And it could push people backwards and, you know, you've got to have

Um your intuition about you. I'm not going to say that all of the queer Community is Fabulous As is nor, you know, some good, some bad, some in between. And so the same for the broader Community, find the right space to be yourself and do what you want to do. Be what you want to be here. I'll leave it there. Take it out today with a bit of. Well, I'm going to call it cow punk from the 80s and it's the Johnny's. There's going to be a showdown. Hopefully, it's a peaceful one. Thanks for tuning in to out of the pan.
