It's probably bits of all of it and non Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Australia including myself. We asked what could we do? What had could we have done? But is that going to change anything? I'm not sure that it necessarily will. So certainly

A very sad situation but some relevance to this program not under Scott, not or say understating the paying for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people as we've already seen the relative right try to move on the queer communities, particularly trans with the same old Antics bad pun intended, turning up in the Senate this week with right-wing, Senator Alex antic.

Say psychological attacks and political attacks on a range of people and, you know, it's not going to be that easy. And so, it got me thinking as much as I try to do that, or sometimes try to avoid it, you know, sort of, where do we go from? The a sort of here in this sort of stuff, you know, what do we

Need to do to counter and remember a situation that emerged at 3 CR a few years ago where we faced a difficult situation and the late great Ralph McKnight said, well, you know, we can use our hands which is useful. We can use our heads but we need to use our hearts and I think the answer will come from our hearts and places of kindness will have to push through will have to be also use

Go ahead and be smart about it, but it can be done. So it just, it does seem frustrating when we seem like we are stalled and it's going to take a lot of effort. I can understand where people are coming from there, but we will have to dig deep and that's when you are already traumatized. That's challenging, I respect that as well, but it sort of seems to be where it's at over often, wonder if that's a good.

Deliberate tactic on behalf of right-wingers to try to wear people down. And that's not, I don't think that's a cynical remark at all. So we're going to have to hang together. You know, we've seen good examples of leadership in our own Community from radical women Freedom, Socialist Party who try to bring Progressive voices together. And I think that's a sensible strategy because we need to learn from, you know, sort of previous history. That's that well.

Well, known statement attributed to Martin bormann about first, they came for and then they came for and then they came for me and there was no one left to defend me. So I think we are trying to do that in society but they're just, it's also about countering misinformation which was a big factor in my opinion, in what happened and that there wasn't whilst there was, let's say, a proverbial strong locked in. Yes, vote for The Voice, the soft.

Sort of vote? Yes. Voters were not convinced perhaps. There's a cop. Well there's a contrast would be the exact word to the marriage equality issue. Where many of those so-called soft voters did come across in due course this didn't happen for the voice. So we've got work to do. Situation here in Victoria's, we have overwhelmingly had a government that has been supportive on lgbtiq, i+ issues, and that's, of course, incredibly welcome. But we also need to make sure that we keep that on track. I haven't had a chance to comment in great detail about the retirement of Daniel Andrews and I am not a political again, I'm not a political analyst of any sort.

But certainly whilst is will say to be balanced. There's debate about certain issues and how nothing seemed to stick to him and all those sorts of things.
