He's not intersex whose sex characteristics feet medical and social norms of man male or female as assigned at Birth, but this article uses of the term say small possible content note DSD athlete a different less linear personal biology. We can deal with it impossibly difficult balance of Interest. I don't agree. You know, let's look at this logically, why is test even if testosterone was an issue? I'm not for a second going to say it automatically is white.

How does that come into chess? Why have trans women been banned by the chess world body from playing against this women. Why does a cis woman boycott an event because she's up against a trans woman in darts. So if there's no physical contact no physical real physical strength stamina or physique issues. What's the issue if there is non-contact Sport? Well, I can tell you now is someone who is doing a form of exercise regularly and tries to and it involves being engaged with people of all backgrounds when it comes to sex and gender. I don't feel I've got any advantage no matter how much I physically train or train in this particular form of exercise. And so that's not accurate. What about contact sport? Well is you know, the question therefore comes in again, even if there is something about a testosterone-fueled body. Is it going to be different for everyone? Do we need to test everyone not at random including those competing in male Sports lots to consider here.

Well ugliest absolutely she comes from extreBe poverty. It has gone through Blood Sweat and Tears to even be at the Olympics and Simone biles the gymnast nothing to do with trans. So, of course just to be clear getting backlash. She doesn't smile before she prepares for an event another stereotype. Well Grace Tame, I'm sure would occur.

With that a lot of people are being challenged and triggered by successful women who winning with their tenacity resilience and extraordinary skills in sport. He here so look totally agree. And this is what this all comes down to that. If you're not if you don't look like a big big big big big multiple inverted commas girly girl in big big big multiple and Ville inverted commas. You're attacked for being too masculine, or if you don't your testosterone doesn't fit someone else's idea of what that should be you're being attacked. So very very true Roving. Thank you. I meant to say that myself and forgot and this is what this is coming down to and you know trans and intersex people and for that matter people who assists and intersex who don't in inverted commas look like typical typical double inverted commas close double inverted commas men or women, of course often face this you know, so all sorts of people who don't fit gender and gender stereotypes. Well, we have a right to exist as who we are.

On if you're in the paper version page 28 and article by Olivia Island discrimination claims going nowhere three-quarters of discrimination complaints made to the Australian Human Rights Commission are dismissed or abandoned prompting legal experts to say the body is in inverted commas Toothless and hamstrung by outdated thinking 30% of to that two and a half thousand 2562 complaints of wrecks sex race disability or age discrimination.

Termination in 2:40 resolved through conciliation and a further 60 percent were terminated declined or discontinued while nine percent were withdrawn and the commission doesn't have the power to decide if unlawful discrimination has occurred it tries to resolve claims through conciliation outcomes range from an apology to reinstatement to a job compensation for lost wages or policy changes and then complaints may go to court so barrister Neal has said that it can't resolve the dispute which seems quite bizarre that it can't really resolve it through sort of conciliation.

There's needs to be compulsory processes of mediation or conciliation for every complaint and a commercial law principle lawyer Josh Bernstein is critical of the obligation on claimants to take their claims to the commission first before applying to the courts the and it says that the human right the Australian Human Rights Commission doesn't have the resources to effectively efficiently concealed at all. The complaints it's receives in their lengthy delays and you know sort of and he's made an interesting comment. It's a product of thinking years ago about the need to get parties together to do all very quietly and under the radar. I he has his him saying this he thinks that thinking is outdated and hasn't served us.

Well now that's interesting because of course a lot of queer people traditionally have not wanted to be very public particularly still some trans people and I think that that option to for privacy and that sort of thing really needs to be considered. So yeah roving definitely the you've said is it another toothless tiger institution, you know, that's a reasonable comment.

The Victorian law does seem to be more powerful and it points out that this only classifies complaints by the four Federal Acts. And the sex Discrimination Act is where to use precise language sexual orientation gender identity and it's still called intersex status hoping it will be updated to variation of sex characteristics as the fair work. Act was updated in the last couple of years. The only federal law change that and the federal labor government is done and sort of Mark Dreyfus has declined to comment.

Well, I think we need a little better than that from sort of Mark Dreyfuss on that we need for reform of the there was proposals backs many years ago now in 2013 to overhaul federal anti-discrimination law put it in one acts. So save a lot of quadruple ocation to invent a word and just put all the necessary attributes in which would be probably a little clearer but also look at all the powers that needs to make sure it can do its job effectively and prevent discrimination, but unfortunately in one of the debates that's occurred over recent years is the sort of tracking debate of individual freedom and that's not what the Human Rights Commission was really set

up to do was set up to stop discrimination and the fact that it's work has been watered down with less funding over. The last few years is appalling and roving made a great comment here. Look at how Brittany Higgins has been treated by our own court case. Why would people want to go public now? Yeah, I agree with that. You know this. just something that's not just about so many of these systems that are either toothless or set up to favor those with more power and I'm not going to say any more than that just to say that I'm somewhat experiencing a little of that at the moment, but with a large institution that's supposed to be human, but I don't really think it is being that way. All right.
