So there's that's the thoughts.

I think we will do a general content note for today because it's very hard not to discuss this day without talking about, well, transphobic hate and difficulties we face. So switchboard is there on 1 800, 1845 27 as part of Q life around Australia and there's also rainbow door One eight hundred seven two nine three six seven and say that again one eight hundred seven to nine three six seven and zero four eight zero. Zero one, seven, two, four. Six is an SMS line for rainbow door so lots of services out there if you need them on this day.

Yeah, a difficult time at the moment. I mean, it always is every year, it has its ups and downs this time of year. When we look at trans day of remembrance, let's just recap how it came about back in the late 1990s. It was organized, following the death of Rita Hester and her friend Gwen, Gwendolyn Ann Smith decided to start a vigil for her which then spread around the world and we acknowledge those we have lost often, you know it started of course, sadly difficult content, just do to sort of transfer because hate crimes and severe violence and it should also be noted according to Wikipedia other people involved, as well as Gwendolyn Ann Smith were Nancy, Nanga Roni and Shahara de Alto. And it was importantly and, and this is something we'll need to discuss to memorialize the murders of black Trans woman Rita Hester in Allston Massachusetts and Chanel picket in Watertown Massachusetts and so that was what led to T door being me being brought about and now it's sort, of course, Very prominent this year difficult as it is. We've seen this ongoing. well, rise in trans hate abandonment of trans people in many places and some and around the world to some degree. And, you know, obviously it is the proverbial elephant in the room as they say, but we can't ignore the recent us election. And what that means, not only for Trans people in the US but for what it means for people around the world. But what I wanted to do the theme on today, as we have a choice.

We have a number of choices as to how we respond. And look, I'm the first to admit that I've stayed away from a lot of media, both so-called traditional and social media in the last couple of weeks trying to process what it means and that sort of thing. And I also going to be open, I've had some pretty challenging issues in my life, which have brought up some mental health issues, and this has been incredibly difficult. So I've I've had to do some self-care, which will have to do first from time to time. It's

and that's I think a good rule as we have this discussion today as it is for anything that you have to, you know, sort of do activism in a benign way for yourself, not in a selfish way. So to speak, otherwise you can't do anything for anyone activism or otherwise and everyone will have their own ways of dealing with that.

But I sort of having had a little time to reflect and a couple of things have clicked into my head, over the last couple of days in conversations. With people, I just thought I'd raise this and see what people think and feel what can we do? Proactively and practically a couple of peas there in terms of, you know, what can we do. And you know, let's start and also what can we not?

Now, I heard one phrase came to me, sort of second or third hand, I won't give the exact language and that was welded. A majority of Americans have pooped in their own bed. Let them lie in the poop. Well, the problem is a lot of Americans didn't vote for Donald Trump and what he may or may not do and for Republicans. Generally and a lot of people who didn't vote for, you know, I'm going to be very - you know, most likely, or at least some probability. I'll be try to be balanced. As I can be negatively affected. And the thing is, is that really a kind thing to do or a thing even to think probably not now in an Ideal World, you know, sort of something how Donald Trump would disappear. And so would JD Vance that's unlikely. So what is positive and pragmatic? We can do. Well, the thing is and also that there is the concern. Let's start with so-called Australia which is where this broadcast originates from lands of the call and Nations. Now called Australia we I think we need to just take a deep breath here.

The thing in America horrible is it is is that the Republicans have control of the presidency, the two houses of Congress, and the Supreme Court, and a lot of the system's appointing people behind them. Australia is very different. We have at least a much better electoral system. Is it Perfect? Probably not but it doesn't have the gerrymanders in our House of Representatives that the American House of Representatives has and the way that the boundaries are drawn sometimes where they know how people are going to vote. They'll just draw a line down the middle of the street. And people on one side of a street can be voting in one electoral congressional district, and another Australia is much better than that. There's a very small variation so of the 151 seats in our house of reps. All have simply equal numbers and there's some degree of fairness. There's an electoral commission which is bureaucrats who are this time, independent, not appointees. So that's those sorts of things that I think Safeguard us. We go through a different process to appoint judges to our high court and yes times it's been dominated by more conservative thinking as opposed to smaller liberal thinking, but they're at least is better process.

You've been also got a look at the fact that the Senate given current voting patterns will likely, you know, sort of always be most likely be a balance of power situation. It would be very rare in the Australian National Parliament that you would find both either labor or liberal nowadays with the majority in both houses of Parliament. And the last thing I'll claim to be as a pollster. But most polls at the moment are predicting a so-called hung Parliament for after the next federal election, whenever that may be held.

Now, I do have a concern here, is that there's going to be a sort of, you know, across partisan Coalition. There's it's not an impossibility that Labour and liberal might effectively be joined together in a konso called consensus government which I don't think would be consensus at all because you've got a range of people who feel across this political Spectrum who feel very disenfranchised at a national level by the to ooh, so-called larger parties. I will never call them major in this country and haven't for years at the moment. But that aside we have a relatively stable democracy and, you know, there is more safeguards here. So we have a sense of privilege. That's one sense of how can we use it? I suppose is my thought and it's why I open today.

One of two reasons I happened today with Caitlin Harnett and the Pony Boys don't give up on me from the 2016 album late-night Essentials and the other reason is to mention that Kaitlyn honey will be playing the Northcote Social Club next Friday night and I might be you and her and along and go there and also queenscliff musical festival next weekend. I won't be at that one. So yeah, we don't, don't have to give up. We don't have to despair. We don't have to get cynical and yeah look putting some funny memes up. It's helpful. You know, the one About you know, what is it? Canada feels like and now living above a meth lab or something is kind of amusing, but it doesn't really. It gives us a moment to relief, but it doesn't really do

a lot. So I'm putting it out to you do, fabulous, awesome listeners because of course, no Pro 3 CR doesn't have regular listeners. We only have awesome ones. Once said, just when you think you've got the answers, we've changed all the questions. Well, let's ask some questions. What can we do? There is a pendulum swing with voters. And although I'm optimistic about our voting system, maybe the progressive side also need some self-reflection on different techniques of actors and that's not as polarizing in as the USA, especially for younger generation, EG Legacy, Media is on the decline. We need to reach out to diverse opinions and not live in a bubble, no matter how challenging it may be to us. And then also goes on to say sadly, Trump's infants, who have significant effects in Australia, is some parties adopt, some of his tactics, we should be alert, but not alarmed and never complacent, especially with women's rights here.

Yeah, look, I would agree with all of that, that's a fair point to. And we have to look at, for example, Queensland, which now has a little n Ln, P state government and they only have one house of parliament. Ironically the Upper House of Parliament was abolished by the Alp as part of their original platform, way back in 1922. And so the fact that the Liberals are Nationals have a majority and there's still some Katterites in the Queensland State Parliament. Now, there is an example. Yes, sadly of where things, like trans rights When we rights women's rights abortion rights. Now there is a possibility. They could go backwards particularly including on a condom so called conscience vote. And the thing is a contra conscience vote to work. Every individual has to be have a conscience. There can't be one side, having it in the other, you know, one of the larger parties having it in the other, not Tim Wilson and Goldstein,

It's an interesting one you know, whether people will think Zoe Daniels has done a good job I'm no, I can't say I've walked around any streets in Goldstein for a while even though I did grow up there many moons ago, but you know, whether people, you know, will shift back to the major parties, whether they'll feel that they need the check and balance of the teals. I honestly can't like, obviously can't quite answer. That would be interesting to see what people are saying on the ground. Yeah, look, there is a pendulum swing. We do seem to becoming more conservative, which I'm well, you know. Look, we look at the uncertain Economic Times, the difficulties with the Kazi lives. Now, technology, we went through that thing, we can't talk about called covert, I'll download just mention it when you're went through that for two years, it created a lot of uncertainty and people, you know, sort of We'll learn what I'm after. You know, crate creates uncertainty, and people tend to generally stay not want less change in times of conservatism but I suppose from a transport of view, how my question? Then if we going to be proactive is particularly this time of year on this day, how do we convince people that, you know, trans, you know, just being respectful to trans and sort of

Giving all trans people of all ages, health care and medications. That we need is not really. That is not written anything in inverted, commas, radical, or even Progressive. It's just basic human rights. So, they're the sort of questions is how I agree with you. It's how we campaign and this is something that I don't think progressives have done well enough. In all honesty. I certainly agree with you on that. We need to look at techniques and I'm just talking here, you know, social media versus Legacy me.

I think that certainly Factor but, you know, it's sort of unfold. Yeah, it's a very challenging one, you know, just try to stick to logic isn't Nano and say, well, yeah, sort of, you know, sort of saying, hey, look, the evidence says that trans medications do benefit kids, and the cash report was a load of bunkum and has been proven to be. So, in this day and age of, yes,

Of media, it's and fast-spreading social media, it's not easy, but I suppose if the internet and social media can be used to spread hate and fear and misinformation, how do we use it to spread the Opposites courage, love, and positive information, whilst getting that message across effectively? And I think that, you know, I'm just going to throw one thing in their emotions and feelings that we have as queer. People are valid and they can run deep. And that's personally what I'm finding out

The moment even though it's only indirectly to do with being queer and it's nothing really to do with the theme of this program by and large. But it's again, we have a choice, what do we do? Proactively and roving also, just written that clarification, pendulum swing in the UK where they voted out a right-wing government and just want change. Yeah, it seemed everyone sort of Click, Click. Look, we are desperately looking for something. And who's going to provide it is the question who will be able to find a way to give people what they want in a

You know, in a way that's well, the in very simple over simplified off the top of my head language, the best, I don't know what the answers are. As I say, I'm here asking the questions and we need to ponder them. And I had to say, I don't have all the answers, but I sort of have least thought of today, I've tried to put a process in place to start asking the questions and part of that also came from hap spontaneously.
