Fiercely protective Lee and proudly a bisexual man. Yeah, he felt fiercely and proudly protectively and all that sort of thing. But I suppose, the thing that start what one way to dive into this conversation is what was the was there? Anything that sort of began to well go on?

Awful sorry. / put a light bulb on that says we needed a by plus specific survey of sexual health and HIV need Steve. Well, I started off in that HIV sector in HIV advocacy and trying to advocate for by plus people by plus being the umbrella term for all multi-gender attracted people. We there's there's no data there are bits and Bobs, you find them. You find data from the

Gay community periodic survey. You find it from other places. There has never been a study on the sexual health of by plus people in Australia. So this is the first ever study on the bisexual or by on the sexual health and HIV is of bisexual people. So that's a pretty good reason for us to get started and because, you know, I can do as much advocating as I want, I can knock on doors, I can ask for funding, but you need that evidence base and we are finally building that evidence-based and I was really

Inspired. Well, we were really inspired by the incredible work that the trans Community, the transgender diverse Community could in a number of years ago in building up this evidence base. And then we've seen just incredible allocation of resources still a long way to go. And we're hoping that through this will be able to change policy, will be able to get funding. Allocated, will be able to change the lives, by plus people because by plus people in Australia face, some of the worst Social and Health outcomes within the Lgbtq+ Community. Well, sadly, that is the case and there's been that sort of. I mean, there's a starting point. I mean, there has been that sort of will say, general research on the lives, generally, of, by plus people, the 2009-10 study. It's one that leaps out in from an Australian perspective. And I never found out exactly what happened with all the information from that. Because I think it was Split in Two by P sis by

Table and then Trends such gender diverse by people. But yeah, those sort of outcomes on health because of the sort of copying it from both sides and you don't fit the broader Community, don't fit the queer Community, which of course you can figure anywhere you like. It's just a Real Testament to show that by plus people want their voices heard, because we've actually never been asked these questions before. We have literally never been asked these Quinn are, or we ask questions, about sexual identity, sexual behavior, relationships, sexual health,

Sti HIV testing. We also go into other aspects, like relationships, alcohol and drug, use sexual, violence and coercion mental health. We actually take a really broad ballistic view of what sexual health is. It's more than just a, you know, I keep on saying it's more than a sexual health study, it's going to be a revolution. Yeah, no, absolutely because the thing is, well, I mean this lie, I suppose links back. I mean sadly, we have had, I'll say bye and visibility which I sometimes feel is the slightly.

Community advisory Council made up of 5 plus people from all parts of Australia bringing in their knowledge, bringing in their their expertise as community members. And we sort of get the, we get to, you know, hash ideas out with them and make sure that what we are presenting to the community is something that the community wants. And so the feedback that I get from people, when they fill this out, is that they have never filled out a survey that has made them feel so,

So scene and that has been so diverse. And that has been so accepting of everyone. Because we know that the bi plus Community due to the exclusion where face the aerator, where face the feelings of being different to both the mainstream and the queer Community. We have developed this beautiful little, the world of acceptance. And this survey is a part of that. We really got went to great efforts to make sure everyone felt included and

Yeah. That's that's something I'm really proud of the study. Yeah, well look therein lies a point. I mean, you know, of course, by people are have all the intersections so to speak with absolutely speeds of each trans, and gender diverse, which mentioned, and Multicultural, background race, and similar Euro, Divergence disability and all those sorts of things and, you know, sort of, you know, sort of let's say,

Say how does that work into the, the survey as well as those sorts of aspects? Yeah, exactly. And you know, it's the sexual health, especially and the HIV Health Care needs of by plus people just really. It's been overlooked. Yeah, because we sort of we've seen historically that the, you know, the queer Health sector will try and handball. Some of that some of the community off. Because, you know what, if you're a bi plus person in a different gender relationship, how are you?

By the system and we are trying to encourage the system to view by people are by regardless and we face no matter what our relationship looks like. Whether we are in one or not, we have very unique needs and we need services that cater to those needs, and we currently don't have those. So we're really hoping that there will be real change. Real policy, change changes on the ground. We're going to be knocking on so many doors. We are going to be annoying as hell when the results of this coming out and create some positive.
