And the fact that women by sexual services from sex workers has been sanitized by arguments, not many women do this, not true. I'd like, I would like to have in fantasy the evidence but I'm sure it's there and the behavior of

I'm women and men buying sexual Services is different also not true. So we don't know how many people buy sexual Services because sex work is so stigmatized and often people won't admit that they might pay for sex, whether it's of any form. So that most people don't know that buying sexual services, including human connection and intimacy and there's lots of reasons. It can be very therapeutic and others are shifting energies for

Example, and that I really like this comment. Another reason why we don't know how many women by sexual Services is because gender-role purists construct, men as being inherently exploitative when they buy sexual services from women, but women doing the same thing as errant and that's where the little hint came in. I mean, this says women, buying sexual Services. Now you might get the services from my male, sex work, you might get them from a female and you might get them from a non-binary type of sex worker.

And half of the 21 women that Hillary interviewed for her. Research said they had therapeutic goals railing for ranging from his healing sexual trauma or physical conditions. Such as Vagina vaginas. Sorry the vaginas mus painful or impossible percent. Penetration others wanted to learn about their bodies and experiment, different desire or types of Partners, and your responses, to receiving pleasure. So I think this is a really

Good conversation to have and of course in a world where hopefully we value all genders and sexualities equally. One of the things when we do try to talk about intersectionalities is your you can have a service that is lgbtiq or transfer. And Lee is it sex worker friendly and why do we say that? Because research from Victoria's peer-based sex, work organization, Vixen Collective, found that two-thirds of sex workers are. I will say lgbtq I don't think there'd be and we don't know about intersex and or asexual aromantic and I think that makes a lot of sense.

If you let's say you a person does come to you. And wants for example, I can Central threesome of some sort, it might be regardless of gender. So there's one possibility so I think it's really important. That sex work is looked at positively from a queer perspective because so many sex workers, do come under the rainbow somewhere, and they're just a lot of myths out there and great to see.
