Let's also put the other side of the coin. Yeah, Barry Humphries was a talented creative person. Who worked his armpits off and had some creative genius. Does that excuse the behavior as a person? Probably not now, how then do you hold space for both? Can you should you? These are the tough questions. I don't think there are easy answers. And now, it's also about how do you call in? Is there? Someone who can, you know how?

Also I want to mention the pride Center situation where at the time I said I didn't have access to all information. I'll just say I have more information than I have now and so that may have had, I had that information. I may have made a different comment than what I did, six months.

Where is it now? For 26 months ago, on that sort of, you know? And so if there was any disrespect from my remarks that point I apologize, but we had a, we draw a line here. I mean just yelling at people. Well, that's not good enough. Now sort of well done to the people there and well done to Michael Barnett and others who filmed and photographed.

I'm right in the thick of it, that's not easy to do no matter what happened. But let's it's just, I personally find these some of the things that are happening at the moment. Of course, I feel very frustrated at the nonsensical ality and irrationality of those things that are happening in that, you know, reading dragged kids, is this, suddenly going to sexualize people. What's let's ik.

Okay, what has drag performance got to do with sex? It's just an art form, it's a dress up and look at all the various forms of entertainment that involve. What might, what Society calls in inverted commas, gender-bending. Really. So, let's see. Do we start stopping pantomime for kids, you know, Shakespeare wasn't. I'm now I must admit, I wasn't exactly. Enthralled by Shakespeare in skin,

But I think I remember the character park or someone in A Midsummer Night's Dream who had some form of what we would call gender diversity. I don't see all these right-wing snobby types suddenly saying we should ban Shakespeare. I mean it is just utterly ridiculous now now it's sort of I'm someone who performs I'm trying some new genres at the moment. Watch this space if you like but I had previously done stand-up now identify

I as a trans woman, I know that and all I would hope all the wonderful listeners to 3 CR know that. And so, but let's say, I went to Tennessee and did stand up and they would call me. Of course, stupidly performing is another gender if I was performing in front of minors. So I can't possibly adults now as well. So I couldn't do. Stand-up saying I'm a woman. Now, I could use the name. Sally goldner, not mention gender, I

Not that I would want to, of course, I was a man and I could go there. I mean, it's just utterly ridiculous, the stupidity of it, but this is what happens when you have irrational people. You know, you can, you know, you might have, don't have to agree with everything but you can be open to listening what stops people being open to listening is emotional blockage and it just seems that either this one of two things, the people who are against drag storytime, who are against trans people have an emotional blockage

Or they are lying to themselves maybe both because I just don't I struggle to understand how people can hold these beliefs. I knowledge that there's a world of a kaleidoscope of views but it just seems absolutely bewildering to me that now we can have these things happening. So again well done to Monash Council well done to, you know the people who would the Igbtqia+people who went there.

And stood up against these sort of right-wing networks. Not from what I understand, only, you're very tiny. Number of whom were people who either will say, live work, or study in the city of Monash for those Beyond Melbourne. And perhaps, particularly Beyond Australia, city of Monash is a local government area around 20 kilometers to the southeast of the Melbourne. Business district, disclosing any possible interest? I know I presented lgbtiq training.

For them in a previous role some years ago and they were just very open and receptive and have done wonderfully as our most local government areas in Melbourne. And I just think we've got to just sort of, it's not right. That we have to go through all this stuff is trans and Igbtiq a plus, but we can stand firm and we'd urge people to also stand firm against verbal threats and those sorts of things. We sorry, we need you to guide us as to what you want, and that might change in various situations could depend on the level of threat, but just shouting at people. Yes, it's not right, but it's, we will, we will be there with you and I think that what I'm beginning to gather as a lot of our communities are working, how do we work together and coordinate strategy are not just within queer communities but across those who are effectively threatened by Nazis as someone of Jewish background. Yeah.

That very much affects me personally, someone with three of my four, grandparents who, thankfully, got it, early enough out of Continental Europe and that is in my bones as have spoken about publicly before had a message in. It is from Kayleen one of our awesome listeners. Remember listeners to 3 CR, programming, just regular listeners weather, no matter how frequently they message in, whether it's a first time or not and kahlan is set in terms of learning and adapting, didn't Benny Hill, learn why?

Republican rep had decided to run for the Senate and Zephyr, which is the more powerful houses in u.s. so State and National legislatures and she and then defeated a republican opponent Sean, Patrick McCoy and became the first trans woman to be elected. To the Montana legislature alongside SJ, how the first non-binary person to be elected and so she got it in 2023, but so there's the background.

And and what sort of really got things going in the last week or so is during a debate on the 18th of April. In, obviously speaking against a bill prohibiting gender affirming, medical care for minors. She said, and I quote, and I will say some people may have their thoughts about this, but so just small breath quote, if you are forcing a trans child to go through puberty when they're trans, that is tantamount.

To torture in this body. Referring to the parliament should be ashamed. The Republican Majority Leader. Su Vinton objected and Zephyr replied saying. The only thing I will say, is if you vote

Yes on this. Bill, and yes on these amendments. I hope there's next time. There's an invocation. When you bow your heads in prayer, you see the blood on your hands end, quote House, Republicans didn't like that at all. So Hannah let's just stop that we get call got I just I'm not even going to repeat the names. All sorts of things by people who would oppose

Bose us, but we stand up and call it bluntly. And this the Republicans have a hissy fit. What's that old saying, you know, with about schoolyard, bully? When someone finally stands up to the bully runs off crying. Mummy, boo, bullying me. So the Montana Freedom caucus issued, a statement misgendering Zephyr calling her for censure, but it didn't descent you didn't happen. She stood by her words. The minority Democrat Democratic party. Leader describe the statement as

Full and the farthest thing imaginable from the commitment to civil discourse, and then the house Speaker refused to let her speak on any bills, despite no sense. You're taking place. But she wasn't blocking traffic at all.
